PEDAL PRIX

Sunday, July 28th saw Blue Thunder racing around the Victoria Park track competing in Race 4 of the Australian International Pedal Prix. Our vehicles passed scrutineering, the week before at Mount Gambier, and an early start on Sunday morning had our pits set up ready for the 6 hour racing event.

All of our riders did an amazing job with no major mishaps, completing 107 laps with a best speed of 39.392 km / hour and finishing in 26th position in Category 1 out of a field of 68. The High School team also raced well, completing 112 laps and a best speed of 32.263 km/hr. They finished 34th in Category 3 out of a field of 39.

Overall placings were Blue Thunder, 118th and Naracoorte High School 105th out of 172 vehicles across the 3 categories.

I would like to thank our band of willing parents who helped us to get to Adelaide, helped with setting up, taking down, pit management and feeding the hungry hordes. Special thanks to Wayne Garrod for towing the trailer to and from Adelaide.

All in all a great weekend with no mishaps, which means no major repair work required! YAY!

10 WAYS TO BUILD CONNECTION DAILY

We don't need to have deep and meaningful conversations with kids every day. In fact, if we did, they would run a mile. But there are little gestures that build connection instantly:

- 1. A quick pat on the back or a touch on the shoulder
- 2. A fly-by kiss on the head or a hug
- 3. A wink
- 4. Holding a gaze, a little longer than usual and smiling
- 5. An in-joke.
- 6. Noticing something personal, like "We have the same hands"
- 7. A quick text message
- 8. A few minutes of focused one-on-one time
- 9. Turning your phone off when they want to talk to you
- 10. A coffee together

Outdoor Learning in Science



Year 5 Students have been busily investigating biological Science.

Our learning outcome 'Living things have structural features and adaptations that help them to survive in their environment'


This has led our learning to finding out about adaptations of animals and plants and the unique features they have adopted in order to survive. Recently we learnt about plants. We took our learning into the nature park. We had to observe and record a native plant and apply what we know. We attempted scientific observational drawing.

We are fortunate enough to have Michelle Stewarts expertise to help us out too with her plant knowledge.


Students observations included:

- ∂ $\,$ The leaves angled towards the trunk to make the water flow to the roots
- ∂ ~ Some of the leaves smell strong like "Vicks" ~
- $\partial \quad {\rm Gum} \ {\rm trees} \ {\rm have} \ {\rm a} \ {\rm main} \ {\rm trunk} \ {\rm with} \ {\rm smaller} \ {\rm branches}$
- ∂ $\;$ Some of the flowers grow out of the bark
- ∂ $\;$ Most of the flowers are yellow/orange
- ∂ The gum leaves smell
- ∂ The leaves are waxy. This helps to stop moisture loss
- $\partial ~~$ Gum leaves hang downwards
- ∂ $\,$ Gum leaves turn away from the hot sun to conserve energy and water
- ∂ $\;$ They have leaves all year
- ∂ The plants in our area had leaves that were all different thickness
- ∂ Some have 'nuts' that stores the seeds to grow new plants
- ∂ $\;$ The seeds come out when the nuts get super dry
- ∂ Some Australian plants need fire to make the seeds to grow






