A burst of hot weather this week reminds us of summer safety, including bushfire preparedness, wearing hats, staying in the shade and keeping hydrated. We also need to be vigilant in our yard with some recent sightings of some slippery wildlife.

Our Professional Development Day last Friday was an excellent day, with Simon Breakspear leading over 150 educators through the teaching sprint process and challenging our thinking about improving teacher practice. We worked through the day as a school team and also networked with colleagues from across the Limestone Coast. While teachers were busy at 'The Barn', our SSOs worked through a series of online courses suited to their student support work.

We continue to access quality training and development opportunities for our staff with the ultimate outcome being improved student learning and achievement.

### **GOVERNING COUNCIL AGM**

Our very important Governing Council AGM will be held on March 27<sup>th</sup> at 6:30pm in the school library.

Have you considered being on the Naracoorte Primary School Governing Council?

<u>Governing Councils</u> work with the Principal to help set and monitor the direction of the site. We meet twice per term to talk about the direction for the school.

Benefits of being on Governing Council include:

- You get to share your thoughts and opinions and hear what others think.
- You become well informed about what is happening in our school.
- You get to know other parents.
- You get to understand how the school works.
- You learn how things "fit together" at school.

There are a number of vacancies on the Governing Council and parents are elected for a term of two years.

According to our new Governing Council Constitution:

The Naracoorte Primary School Governing Council must comprise of **15** councillors including:

♥ The Principal of the school.

- 2 staff members, nominated to the Council by election at a general staff meeting.
- \$\footnote{1}\$ community representative (nominated as the Deputy Principal).
- 11 elected parents of the school.

2 students nominated by the Student Representative Council will be invited to attend one meeting per term to present a report.

There are also roles on a number of committees where we will be asking for members — Fundraising, Finance, Education, Grounds, Bus and Canteen. Sub-committees are convened by a Governing Council member; however, parents and interested community members are welcome to join a sub-committee without being on the Governing Council. Sub-committees report back to Governing Council and any recommendations from sub-committees are discussed and decided upon at Governing Council.

These committees are vital to the running of the school and we appreciate any assistance that you can give.

Please consider if you would like to be part of this important parent body or one of the associated committees within the school where you can actively participate in decision making.

Students need to be ready to commence school at 9.00 a.m.

Please note students should not be on the school grounds before 8.30am as there is no supervision.

It is important that students are at school on time. If there is a reason that your child is late or needs to leave early they must sign in or out at the front office. This is an Occupational Health and Safety requirement. This also includes a visit to the nearby dentist.

## **BUS NEWS**

Bus Students should have received an updated timetable from their bus driver recently. If you did not receive one, they are available at the front office. Just a reminder that the time on the timetable is a **departure time**, so please ensure that you are at the bus stop prior to this. Thank you.

### **School Bus Pass**

If your child does not normally catch a bus or wishes to use a different bus, it is your responsibility as parents/caregivers to contact the driver to ensure that there is room on the bus. A written note or phone call from the parent is required to confirm the bus travel. Upon receiving this, the student will be issued with a pass to give to the driver as they board the bus. This will then be kept with the bus roll. This will fulfil WHS requirements. If the student is going to catch that bus on a regular basis for a period of time, then they will receive one pass stating the dates that the driver will need to keep with their bus roll.

Please note there is a cost of \$3.00 to use the Town Bus as it is a privately run service.




