WORKING WITH STUDENTS

There are times throughout the year where schools are often looking for people to work as School Support Officers (SSOs) with temporary hours available often on a term by term basis. These hours can be full days or half days depending on the needs of the school or may be fill in days when other SSOs are ill or unavailable.

To be eligible there is an online application process with some mandatory qualifications required including a current Working with Children Check and RAN (Responding to Abuse and Neglect) certificate. No other formal qualifications are needed.

Have a good fortnight and I hope that all families have a safe, enjoyable Easter break.











Thank you


